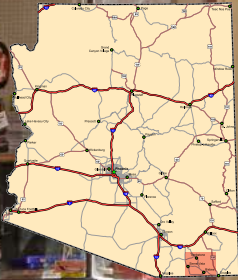


# SIGHTSEEING EXCURSIONS—WEEKEND TRIP

Take a walk into the Wild West in “The Town Too Tough To Die.” Every step along the town’s wooden boardwalks will bring you back to the days of Wild West characters like Wyatt Earp and Doc Holiday. You will be able to practically smell the gunpowder with every shot during the daily reenactments of the gunfight at the O.K. Corral. **1 p.m. Lunch near Tombstone at Big Nose Kate’s Saloon**

**2:40 p.m. Explore Kartchner Caverns**

Do ya’ know the difference between a stalactite and stalagmite? Well, you will once you visit Kartchner Caverns— a living cave and home to the world’s longest stalactite formation and one of Southern Arizona’s most popular outdoor attractions. This is a great chance to escape the summer heat in an incredible underground world of long-hidden limestone caves. **7:00 p.m. Dinner in Bisbee at Café Roka**
